



This holiday apartment is located in the area of Bündnerland, in Switzerland. The main task was to create a new and open ground floor structure that would offer more light and space in the formerly dark interior. For this purpose an integral renovation was conducted including the modification of three bathrooms, a kitchen, three bedrooms and a TV room that can be used as a guest room. Furthermore, the living room has been redesigned and a new fireplace added. An extension to the children's room helped to create a loft-like character. The modification of the interior involved adding a plaster cladding to the wooden ceilings and furnishing concept. A modern lighting system, the renovation of two existing skylights, and the removal of some walls, result in a contemporary and elaborate illumination, as requested by the client.
